














2023 current Early Years Local services:

Auckland

- Preschool, teacher-led, Monday Friday, 8.30 2.30pm during term time
- Preschool Residential courses, Sunday Wednesday, Week 5 and 9 of each school term

Wellington:


 bilingual playgroup, Tuesday mornings at Tawa/Linden and Korokoro (alternate weeks) Playcentres during term time

Christchurch:

- Early Years Whānau Centre, teacher-led playgroup and individual sessions, Monday Thursday, 9am –
 1pm during term time
- Preschool Residential courses, Sunday Wednesday,
 weeks 3 and 7 of each school term

Dunedin:

 bilingual playgroup, Thursday mornings at Sensory Resource Centre (Riselaw Road) during term time



Ko Taku Reo Preschool, Auckland

- 1. Licensed Early Childhood Education and Care Centre for up to 30 children, open 8.30am to 2.30pm Monday to Friday
- 2. Governed by separate Deaf Education ECE Trust (schools cannot govern a licensed EC Centre under current MoE ECE Licensing criteria)
- 3. 4 teachers (3 hearing, 1 Deaf) and3 teacher aides/van drivers (1 hearing, 2 Deaf)
- Free transport service provided for DHH children -3 vans (2 South/Central Auckland, 1 West Auckland
- 5. Curriculum driven by language development and communication, underpinned by Te Whāriki







Early Years Whānau Centre, Christchurch

- 1. Playgroup license whānau led playgroup with registered ECE teachers supporting sessions, open 9-1pm Monday to Thursday
- 2. Parents/Caregivers may attend an individual session for strategies for language development. Individual sessions typically occur between 9:00 10:00 and 12:00 1:00.
- 3. Families attend the group session 10:00 12:00. NZSL tutors provide NZSL tuition for parents during this group session time as well as interaction with children
- 4. Strong whānau connections and collaboration with other professional services

Preschool Courses

- 1. We have 15 courses planned for 2023
- 2. 3 families per course in Christchurch, 1 family (moving to 3 families) per course in Auckland (potential of 45 families per year)
- 3. Sunday to Wednesday
- 4. tailored individual sessions with specialists:
 - 1. Audiologist
 - 2. Speech Language Therapist
 - 3. Early Literacy Teacher of the Deaf
 - 4. Visual Communication practitioner
 - 5. Kaitakawaenga
 - 6. Counsellor/Social Worker
- 5. Time in group sessions at Early Years Whānau Centre (to meet other parents) or Preschool (to interact with other DHH children and staff)
- 6. Transport to and from the course is organised through the National Transport Assistance (NTA) programme through their local DHB (Health funding)
- 7. In-depth report from each specialist giving overview of focus for the course, assessments and things to work on for future.
