



Our Deaf Bilingual Provisions



Students enrolled at Ko Taku Reo attend a Deaf Bilingual Provision, located at one of our partner schools.

- Like any school students are enrolled with Ko Taku Reo
- Integrated with partner schools in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch
- Provide specialist education pathways, according to individual needs and communication modes
- Provisions are bilingual classroom environments where students and teaching teams communicate using:
 - New Zealand Sign Language
 - Spoken English
 - ➢ or signed supported English.
- Staff Allocated annually and attend the partner school.
- Teachers of the Deaf
- Educational Interpreters
- Teacher Aide of the Deaf



Ko Taku Reo Curriculum



We aim to provide high quality teaching and learning programmes, differentiated for Deaf/Hard of Hearing learners and taught by trained Teachers of the Deaf.

We acknowledge that all Deaf learners have different learning needs and different learning styles.

Our teachers teach all 8 areas of the New Zealand Curriculum: • English • The Arts • Health and Physical Education • Learning Languages • Mathematics and Statistics • Science • Social Sciences • Technology

Our Ko Taku Reo curriculum includes Deaf Studies and New Zealand Sign Language, and NCEA pathways taught in the Provisions

2023 Annual Achievement Targets

- Progression Mathematic and Statistics
- 70% of all year 4 to 10 students will show the expected scale score progress from time 1 to time 2.
- 80% of students will achieve NCEA Level 1 Literacy and Numeracy by the end of Year 12.
- Students Attendances: 85% attendances throughout the Year
